

**Academy of Managed Care Pharmacy  
Call for Abstracts  
AMCP Nexus 2018**

The Academy of Managed Care Pharmacy (AMCP) invites submissions for abstracts to be presented at **AMCP Nexus 2018**, which will be held **October 22-25, 2018**, at the Orlando World Center Marriott in Orlando, FL.

Poster presentations provide a forum during which authors can share their insights and outcomes with AMCP Nexus 2018 attendees, who can interact with authors and review their findings.

For each poster, at least one author must be available during the poster presentations to discuss the research and findings. The dates and times for poster presentations for AMCP Nexus 2018 are to be determined.

The three most highly rated abstracts will be selected for a 15-minute podium presentation as part of an education session at Nexus 2018. Exact date and location of the podium session will be communicated to the presenting faculty. Based on the content, the podium presentations may be accredited for continuing pharmacy education credit, so the presentations must comply with AMCP and Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE) requirements. If your abstract is selected for a podium presentation, the AMCP Education Department will work directly with the presenter. Podium presenters will still have the option to present with the other posters.

#### **Important Dates**

- **Wednesday, July 11, 2018, 5:30 pm Eastern** —All poster abstracts must be submitted no later than 5:30 pm Eastern Time (roughly 90 days before the meeting).
- **Mid-August 2018**—Accepted/Rejected email notifications will be sent (roughly 60 days before the meeting).

Every accepted abstract must have one unique author registered to attend the meeting. “Unique” means the same author will not be able to represent multiple abstracts. The first author does not need to be the registered or presenting author.

#### **How to Submit an Abstract**

Abstracts must be submitted online. Please [CLICK HERE](#) to begin your submission.

The submission site will guide the submitter through the process. Once started, work can be saved to be completed at a future time. Abstracts can be revised at any time before the submission deadline, even if they have already been submitted.

## AUTHOR CATEGORIES

Student authors who are the first author have the option of submitting complete or incomplete studies through a non-reviewed track. **All other abstracts must be submitted through the review track** and have complete results at the time the online submission portal closes.

**Professional Reviewed:** For these abstracts, research results must be included in the submitted abstract. Student pharmacists, residents or fellows and graduate students, are eligible for this author category but **will not be eligible** for the best student pharmacist, resident, fellow and graduate students poster competition.

**Student Pharmacist/Resident/Fellow/Graduate Students Non-Reviewed:** This category is only available for **first authors** that are student pharmacists, residents, fellows, or graduate students. These non-reviewed abstracts usually reflect projects where data is not available at time of submission but may be available at the time of the conference. **The first author must be a student pharmacist, resident, fellow or graduate student to choose this category.** Student abstracts are not printed in the JMCP abstract supplement. **If the presenter is not a student pharmacist, resident, fellow, or graduate student, your poster will not be eligible for the AMCP Foundation Best Student Pharmacist/Resident/Fellow/Graduate Student Poster competition.** \* **Students who submit under Professional Reviewed will not be considered in the Student Pharmacist/Resident/Fellow/Graduate Student Non-Reviewed category once the site closes.**

\*Please note that the AMCP Foundation Best Student Pharmacist/Resident/Fellow/Graduate Student Poster competition is usually only held during the AMCP Annual Meeting (Spring of each year) and may occur at AMCP Nexus 2018 in Orlando, FL. [CLICK HERE](#) for more information on the competition.

**Encore Reviewed:** This category applies to abstracts that have been presented and published with another organization. Authors of these abstracts will display the poster at Nexus 2018 using the format required for the conference. The title of the abstract will be included in the JMCP Abstract supplement. **The full abstracts will not be eligible for podium presentations and will not be published in the JMCP Meeting Abstracts supplement because of the copyright ownership of the original presenting organization.**

## AUTHORS

**By submitting an abstract, authors agree to the following requirements:**

- All authors have met the [authorship criteria](#) defined by the International Committee for Medical Journal Editors.
- Abstracts must present content not previously published as an abstract or article (except for Encore abstracts).
- At least one author of each accepted abstract (preferably the primary author) must register for and attend the conference.
- Changes to the abstracts will not be considered after the submission deadline.

## SUBMISSION TYPE

One of three abstract types (defined below) is selected in this step. Once selected, the type for that abstract cannot be changed, but a new abstract may be initiated by the same author.

CHOICE	TYPE	DEFINITION
<input checked="" type="radio"/>	<b>Research Reports</b>	Describe completed original research on managed care pharmacy services or health care interventions. Examples include (but are not limited to) observational studies using administrative claims, reports of the effects of unique benefit design strategies, and analyses of the effects of innovative administrative or clinical programs.
<input type="radio"/>	<b>Economic Models</b>	Discuss models that support various clinical decisions before prospective studies using actual health plan data can be conducted. For example, an economic model could be used to predict the budget impact of a new pharmaceutical product on a health care system.
<input type="radio"/>	<b>Solving Problems in Managed Care</b>	Describe a problem or issue that exists in managed care, the goal for the intervention or practice, and the intervention or best practice implemented to address a specific issue (e.g., introduce a needed change, develop and implement a new system or program, plan and organize an administrative function, or solve other types of problems in managed care settings). Describe what was observed after or when the intervention or best practice was implemented. Provide a general overview of subjective and objective findings and recommendations for future work/research. This abstract type is not as rigorous as a research report, which would describe the outcomes of an intervention. These studies are not at the level to conduct hypothesis testing, so they do not have firm conclusions.

## TITLE/BODY

### Disease or Condition Grouping

Based on ICD-10 codes, insert the ICD-10 block that best describes the disease, diseases, or conditions described in the abstract. These codes are only used to arrange abstracts in the exhibit hall and in the *JMCP* Meeting Abstracts supplement. (This is a useful site to look up ICD-10 codes: <http://www.icd10data.com/ICD10CM/>.) Enter the letter and first two numbers in the block below. Use 00 in the block if it includes many diseases, e.g., Asthma is J45. U00 is used for unclassified topics, such as care management, specialty pharmacy, rare diseases,

pharmacy education, star ratings, pharmacist services, medication therapy management (MTM), outcome analyzers, Medicare Part D, multi-disease studies, accountable care organizations, and the Affordable Care Act.

### **Abstract Structure**

Headings for the abstract sections vary by abstract type and cannot be modified.

For **Research Report** and **Economic Model**, the abstract headings are Background, Objective, Methods, Results, and Conclusions.

For **Solving Problems in Managed Care**, the headings are Problem Description, Goal, Program Description, Observations, and Findings/Recommendations.

The maximum number of characters in the abstract is 2,600, including spaces, and the total number used is tabulated and reported by the submission site. This count does NOT include title, authors, or disclosure statements but does include sponsorship.

### **Sponsorship**

List all sponsors in relative order of sponsorship level. If the work was sponsored fully or partly by your employer, list its name. In-kind sponsors should also be listed.

## **DISCLOSURES**

### **\* *JMCP* Publication Rights**

Encore abstracts will not be published in the *JMCP* Meeting Abstracts supplement due to the copyright ownership of the original presenting organization.

Accepted Professional Reviewed abstracts will be published in the *JMCP* Meeting Abstracts supplement. As such, copyright clearance must be obtained by *JMCP* (see below). One of the following conditions applies to your reviewed abstract submission. All of the following statements must be selected when submitting your abstract online:

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- As author of this poster abstract, I represent that I am the owner of any copyright(s) covering the abstract, and in consideration of the publication thereof, I hereby grant and assign to the Academy of Managed Care Pharmacy (AMCP) an exclusive copyright to publish, reproduce, and/or distribute all or any portion of the abstract.
  - This work was conducted as part of my official duties as an employee of the United States or other government and is therefore in the public domain. Copyright does not apply.
  - This work was conducted in the course of my work as a “work-made-for-hire,” and the work is therefore owned by the organization that hired me to produce this abstract. In consideration of the publication thereof, I attest that the owner of the “work-made-for hire” grants and assigns to the Academy of Managed Care Pharmacy (AMCP) an exclusive copyright to publish, reproduce, and/or distribute all or any portion of the abstract.
  - This work is either a Student Pharmacist/Resident/Fellow/Graduate Student non-reviewed abstract, or an Encore abstract, and copyright clearance is not required.
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## REVIEW AND SUBMISSION

### Submission Instructions

Before submitting, please review your submission based on the following selection criteria. Even after pressing submit, an abstract submission can be revised at any time before the submission deadline, even if they have already been submitted.

### Selection Criteria

Abstracts will be evaluated according to the following criteria, which are also used for *JMCP* manuscript review. Those abstracts with the highest scores (except for Encore abstracts and Student Pharmacist/Resident/Fellow/Graduate Student (non-reviewed categories) will be designated in the *JMCP* Meeting Abstracts supplement and will show a Platinum, Gold, Silver, or Bronze ribbon in the exhibit hall.

- Relevance to managed care
- Originality
- Quality of the work
- Bias
- Clarity

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### View Proof

The proof is the final version of your submission. It can be viewed via the submission site. Please review carefully, since **no changes or corrections are permitted after the submission deadline.**
