AMCP Applauds Introduction of the "Pharmaceutical Information Exchange (PIE) Act of 2017"

The Academy commends Rep. Brett Guthrie (R-KY) for introducing <u>H.R.2026</u>, the "Pharmaceutical Information Exchange (PIE) Act of 2017". The bill aims to improve patient access to emerging medication therapies by clarifying the scope of permitted health care economic and scientific information communications between biopharmaceutical manufacturers and population health decision makers. The bill incorporates AMCP's multi-stakeholder <u>consensus</u> <u>recommendations</u> to allow biopharmaceutical manufacturers to proactively share clinical and economic information with population health decision makers on emerging therapies in advance of Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approval, an area that is significantly restricted by current federal laws and FDA regulations. AMCP Legislative Days: AMCP Leaders, Staff Urge Congress to Tap Managed Care Pharmacy's Expertise, Take Action on PIE

AMCP volunteer leaders and staff gathered in Washington, D.C., on March 6-8 for the Academy's annual Legislative Days event. In more than 50 Capitol Hill meetings, teams of Board members, Committee Chairs (Public Policy and LRAC) and staff discussed the importance of maintaining a comprehensive pharmacy benefit in any new reform legislation that may emerge. Teams also emphasized that managed care pharmacy professionals have the expertise necessary to help lawmakers develop policies for an effective benefit.

In addition, they pressed the need for legislation codifying a preapproval information exchange (PIE) safe harbor to share clinical and economic information on emerging therapies in advance of Food and Drug Administration approval. Legislation was subsequently introduced in April *(see story above)*. In addition,

Dymaxium and the AMCP eDossier System Win Gold Medal Abstract Award at AMCP Annual Meeting

Currently, no FDA-sanctioned safe harbor for the exchange of truthful and non-misleading information exists

between manufacturers and decision makers. The AMCP eDossier System within the

FormularyDecisions.com[®] platform supports the exchange of information, including pre-approval information, and could qualify as a safe harbor. From a November 2016 survey of registered users of the AMCP eDossier System, 100% had requested pre-approval information from manufacturers using the System at least once in the past year. And, 64% are using manufacturer content for pre-approval product reviews. Moving forward, there are opportunities to increase manufacturer support and participation in this pre-approval information exchange through the System, provided identified barriers could be overcome, such as finalizing FDA draft guidance regarding specific information that may be shared. The research was presented at the recent AMCP Annual Meeting in Denver and garnered a Gold Medal Abstract award. Request a copy of the poster here.
