CV Builder Workshop University of Georgia

Project Description & Implementation Overview

The University of Georgia AMCP Chapter conducted a CV Builder Workshop. The workshop included tips on professionalism and interviewing.

Purpose of the Project

The purpose of the CV Builder Workshop was to add value for members of the AMCP Student Pharmacist Chapter. This seminar benefits AMCP student pharmacist members by increasing their awareness of CV preparation. In addition, the seminar provides advice from an experienced professional regarding how to conduct oneself as a professional and interview for jobs/residencies.

Project Budget: Expenses and Revenues

The CV Builder Workshop was sponsored by Pfizer for \$250.

- Meeting facilities: School lecture room (no charge)
- Handouts were emailed, so there was no charge for copy services.
- Catered dinner (\$12/per person, about \$240)

There was no revenue for this event. The purpose was not fundraising, but rather a value added service for AMCP student members.

Who and How Many Chapter Members are Involved?

Chapter officers coordinated the event (President, VP, and Secretary).

Over 75% of chapter members attended the event. Many 4th year students were unable to attend due to rotations.

Who Should be Targeted? Audience or Involvement? How Do You Find Them? How Do You Contact?

- Audience: Current and potential AMCP Student Pharmacist members. This program was meant to add value to a student AMCP membership, as well as attract new members by making it a free "members only" event.
- Sponsor: Network with members of industry or ask your AMCP diplomat if they have any contacts. Our AMCP diplomat introduced our organization to our sponsor.
- Speaker: Again, networking is essential! Seek an experienced professional who has had experience preparing and reviewing CV's. Our sponsor was also our speaker, since he was employed by the pharmaceutical industry.

What Materials are Needed? Outside Resources, Ordering, etc?

- Dinner (call ahead to arrange the quantity of food needed depending on your RSVP list), plates, napkins, serving and eating utensils, cups, ice, & drinks.
- A lecture room with comfortable seating for your audience and an area to set up dinner buffet style.
- Computer with PowerPoint and internet access.

Timeline for Implementation and Execution

- <u>Summer</u>: Officers had conference calls with each other and AMCP diplomat to determine the chapter plans for the upcoming fall semester.
- First couple weeks of fall semester: Secure and contact sponsor and speaker.
- <u>First month of fall semester</u>: Have a chapter meeting to gauge interest and make preliminary plans for date/time/food/location.
- Contact speaker/sponsor to inform of preliminary details.
- <u>One month before event:</u> send reminder emails to sponsor/speaker/chapter members. Book location, contact restaurant regarding food cost.
- <u>Two weeks before event</u>: send RSVP email to chapter members to get head count for dinner.

Notes on CV Workshop

Cover Letter

- Cover letter should address: Why you should get an interview? What sets you apart?
- Always send a cover letter, unless there is a request to not send one.
- Address your cover letter to a specific person if possible.
- Limit cover letter to 1 page with normal margins.
- Do not use form letters- make it personal.
- Do not overuse "I".
- Your cover letter should have a strong opening and closing sentence.

Interview

- Do not mention compensation/vacation during the first interview
- "Head Hunters" (recruiters) are helpful in finding job opportunities
- Be sure to research the company before the interview.
- Good questions to ask during the interview:
 - What is the work environment like?
 - What are important attributes for this position?
 - What is a typical day like?
 - o Can you characterize the management philosophy? What is the corporate culture?
 - What are the opportunities for personal growth within the company?
 - What are typical 1st year assignments?
 - Describe the training program.
 - How are employees evaluated and promoted and what do the promotions entail?
 - o DON'T ASK SALARY!
- Questions you may be asked during the interview:
 - Describe a time when you worked on a team.
 - Describe a time when you had trouble working in a team environment, and what did you do?
 - How do you handle conflict?
- Write thank you letters within 24 hours of an interview to EACH person involved. Email a "thank you" first and then send a handwritten letter.
- In your thank you letter, ask for the job: "I am interested and want to continue the selection process."

Thank you so much for speaking with me the other day. I appreciate you getting back to me so quickly. I have spoken with the president of our chapter and other officers. We all feel that this seminar will be very beneficial to many of the students at the school, no matter what level they are currently at. We liked all the topics that you and I talked about. For CV building we think it would be a big help to not only get advice on how to create a good CV, but also what activities we should be participating in while in school that would stand out to potential employers. Also, what items we should make sure to highlight in our CV (i.e. poster presentations, professional projects, etc.). For potential careers we thought it would be very helpful for you to discuss a broad range of the potential job for pharmacists. A large majority of students only think about hospital and retail as potential careers and don't think of options such as military, managed care, and industry. We also thought it would be helpful to briefly discuss professionalism and give some interviewing tips for jobs or residencies. As yet we do not have our course schedule, so I can't give you any definite dates that we would be looking at right now, but we were thinking sometime after Thanksgiving would be the best time, as the 1st and 2nd year classes will have completed their 12-week finals (and will have considerably more free time) and the 4th year students will be on break for rotations. As soon as the schedule is posted I can give you a more definite time frame that we would be looking at for you to come speak. Thank you again for your prompt response and eagerness to help put this on. It's great to be in an organization with such active and involved professionals that make time for programs that truly benefit students and give us opportunities to learn things we don't always get to hear about in class.
