Members Can Help Shape Latest Version of *Format for Formulary Submissions* 

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AMCP is seeking feedback on its latest update to the <u>Format for Formulary Submissions</u>, <u>Version 4.1</u>, which aligns with recent <u>FDA Final Guidance</u> on communications of health care economic information (HCEI) on unapproved products. The draft *Format*, Version 4.1 explains how to present information and evidence throughout the continuous life-cycle of products in the following areas: pre-approval product dossier, post-approval product dossier, and unapproved indication dossier. <u>Please use the survey</u> to provide feedback by **June 17**. AMCP plans to release *Format*, Version 4.1 in late 2019.
