BECOME FAMILIAR WITH AMCP'S ADVOCACY MATERIALS

Visit AMCP's **Grassroots Advocacy page** to find AMCP's educational materials on our policy priorities and position statements. In particular, please familiarize yourself with the annual "Priority Issues" and the "Where We Stand" series of position statements. The information in these materials will empower you to engage with policymakers and other advocates.

CONNECT WITH YOUR ELECTED OFFICIALS ONLINE

We recommend you subscribe to your state legislators' newsletters and follow their social media accounts to stay informed on the issues they are working on and to provide feedback to their offices. This knowledge may provide insight in how to frame AMCP's priority issues to have maximum impact. In some cases, officials may maintain separate social media accounts for their official capacity and their campaigns. Following both is valuable, but the most advocacy value will be found in engaging with their official account. Be sure to enable the constituent badge on Facebook so that your representatives know that you're one of their voters. Access **the Social Media Guide** to learn more.

REPORT YOUR ADVOCACY ACTIONS

AMCP tracks all advocacy actions, from formal office meetings to social media posts, performed on its behalf and relies on advocate self-reporting to provide that data.
