

Virtual Fall Roundtable University of California San Francisco

Project Overview:

Virtual Fall Roundtable is a large scale networking event that connects students to professionals in managed care/industry. It was the second year of having Fall Roundtable over Zoom, and offered the advantage of extending our invitation to professionals not just in the Bay Area, but across the nation as well. Professionals were grouped together with respect to their area of practice- ie. managed care, insurance, industry (managed care), industry (HEOR), etc. Pharmacy students (P1-P3) rotated through each room for 20 minutes and freely asked questions about their roles, various paths within managed care/industry, and tips about succeeding as a pharmacy student.

Purpose of Project:

With the advent of COVID19, there were strict limitations in place for RCO led in-person events. Using the online platform to our advantage, our mission was to recruit as many UCSF AMCP alumni across the nation as possible, giving our members a more extensive opportunity to expand their network. Previously, when Fall Roundtable was in person, our invitations were limited to UCSF AMCP alumni in the Bay Area. However, taking Fall Roundtable to Zoom allowed us to extend our invitation to many of our alumni throughout the nation.
