Introducing 2026-2027 NW AMCP Board Members



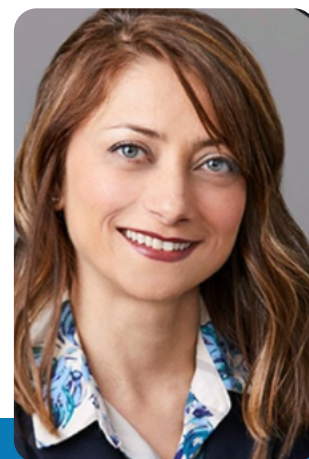
Jennifer Polzin, PharmD

She currently resides in Bend, Oregon where she enjoys traveling and hiking with her corgi pup, Blazer.

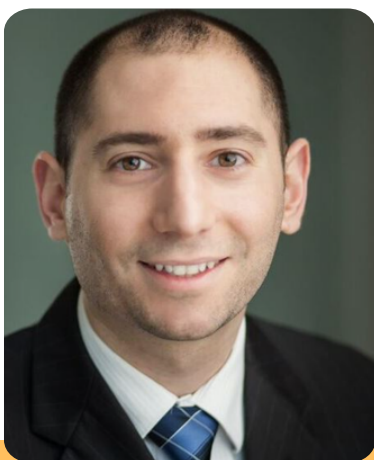

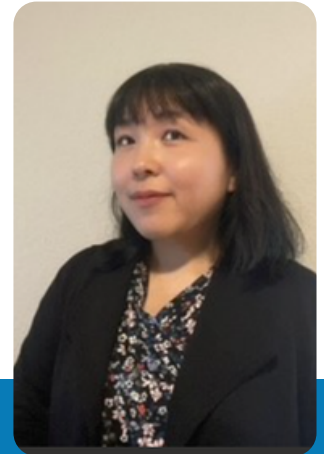

AMCP ANNUAL RECAP



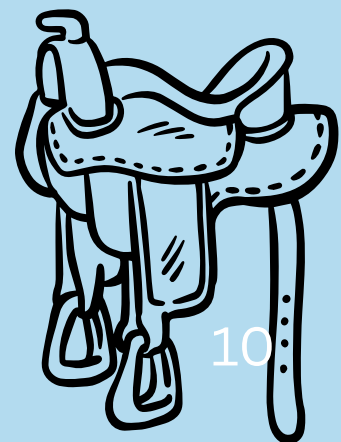

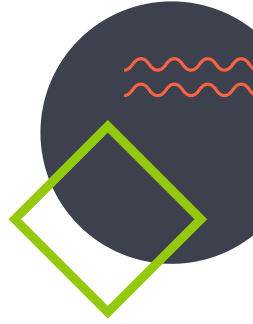

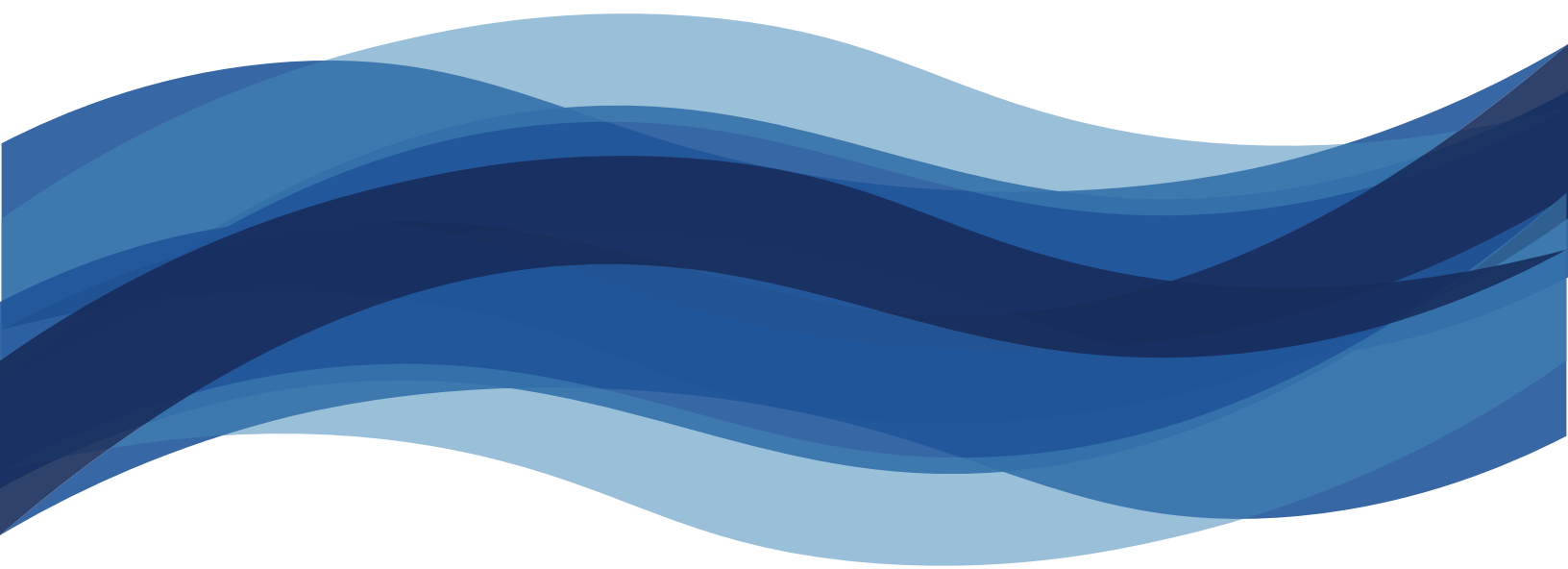
